

CABIN CREW TRAINING



OVERVIEW

The Cabin Crew Training course is a complete training program, designed to train applicants to the level of proficiency necessary to enable them to operate as cabin crew members and issue them an EASA approved Cabin Crew Attestation. During the training program the applicant will complete all the instructional stages of both theoretical and practical training, under the supervision of Global Aviation. The training program is developed in accordance to Part-CC, and it is conducted by Global Aviation's team of instructors, with vast experience in the aviation industry.

PRE-ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- » At least 18 years of age
- » Sufficient knowledge of English Language
- » Valid aero-medical Certificate

THEORETICAL TRAINING

The theoretical training is comprised of 11 subjects and includes approximately 150 hrs of classroom training, inter-active video training, slide presentation, progress tests and sample exams. The theoretical training will supply the student with the necessary tools to qualify and work as cabin crew. The student will be taught to recognise and prevent safety, security and all flight related hazards. Each module defines the course of actions to be taken in all day to day tasks as well as all

unforeseen events which may occur. Various elements will be covered to enhance communicative and performance skills when dealing with diverse cultures on a daily basis. Each lesson is designed to address all relevant information and promote discussions so that critical thinking is created and encouraged. The course uses Global Aviation training material. The 11 subjects are:

PRACTICAL TRAINING

The practical training is comprised of 2 subjects, Fire & Smoke Training and Water Survival Training. Fire and Smoke Training aims to train participants in the prevention and extinguishing of fire and use of fire fighting equipment on board an aircraft. Water Survival Training aims to train participants on the use of the life jacket, the raft and the contents of the survival kit. This course not only provides knowledge but also builds self confidence in order to deal with serious and possibly dangerous situations as a cabin crew member. The student will have the advantage of having all the knowledge needed to impress and conquer an interview. A clear understanding of what the cabin crew position entails and also gains the confidence to strive for that goal with increased chances of success upon applying to a major airline.

Duration & Cost: The duration of the course is 2 months. The cost of the Cabin Crew Training course is €1,500.

CABIN CREW PROFILE

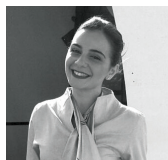

From the role of Cabin Crew you can progress to Cabin Crew Purser.
